

## **Innovation at Campbell**

#### **Experiential learning**

Experiential learning is an engaging learning process where students "learn by doing" and by reflecting on their experiences. In our preschool classrooms, experiential learning activities include (but are not limited to) hands-on experiments, field trips, play invitations, cooking, gardening, robotics etc.

#### Field Trips

Field trips enrich and expand the curriculum beyond the four walls of the classroom. They strengthen observation skills by immersing children in sensory activities, increase 'students' knowledge in a particular subject area, and expand children's awareness of their own community. On field trips, students experience learning in a natural environment where they gain knowledge from engaging first-hand with primary sources rather than through text or pictures. We like to use field trips as an entry event or culminating activity to our preschool Units of Inquiry.

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics)

In our preschool, we frequently integrate STEAM activities, engaging students in problem-solving tasks. This approach allows them to practice crucial skills that extend beyond rote learning, delving deeper into the application of knowledge. By encouraging children to tackle performance tasks, we enable them to produce tangible results that demonstrate their learning. Our Makerspace, a creative hub equipped with various materials and tools, serves as a dedicated area where students can engage in problem-solving, design, and creation. This space isn't limited to specific classes; it's utilized by everyone in our building, including adults, for STEAM, robotics, technology exploration, creative, and collaborative projects.



#### **Outdoor Learning**

We value learning in a multitude of spaces at Campbell. Our outdoor areas offer natural features for students to play, encouraging imagination and creativity. Spending time outdoors habitually can reduce stress, lower disease risks, enhance mental health, and prolong life expectancy. Hence, when our beautiful Colorado weather allows, we often take our lessons outside! The Campbell campus is an ideal setting for students to spend time outside, develop responsibility in caring for our space, and explore the natural world. Classes frequently visit the creek to enhance curricular activities, and just for fun!

#### **Assessment**

Our preschool learning environment nurtures the seeds of unique genius in every child. Our personalized child-centered approach recognizes that every child is uniquely gifted. With that information, we are able to tailor the depth, speed, and complexity of our lessons to each child's needs and learning capacities. ### **About Jeffco Preschool**

Authentic, experience-based, and engaging learning begins in preschool. Jeffco preschools build a foundation of academic, social-emotional, and physical learning so children are ready for school and a thriving future in Kindergarten and beyond.

Our programs are play-based and responsive to student needs so that children can be curious, and joyful, and gain self-confidence while learning through inquiry and developing academic and social-emotional skills.

The Jeffco Public Schools Preschool Program offers a wide variety of quality options for three and four-year-olds at multiple sites across the county. In all classrooms, our students experience academic and social-emotional core instruction and have access to services for English language learners, and identified special education needs. Other program options include International Baccalaureate, Expeditionary Learning, and Dual Language which encompasses native language instruction.

Jeffco Public Schools Preschool Program offers half-day and full-day options for three and four-year-old children in many geographical areas of the district. Children turning three on or before October 1st are eligible to begin preschool. All programs are licensed by the Colorado Department of Human Services and meet the Colorado Department of Education Quality Standards for Early Childhood Care and Education Services.
